



Sheboygan County Food Bank Closed to Public, Food Pantries Modify Distribution Method, and Volunteer Needs Increase

Closed to the Public and Open to Serve Partners

In the wake of the recently declared State of Emergency, Sheboygan County Food Bank will remain open in service to our partners who serve seniors, families, and children throughout Sheboygan County.

Following the recommendations from the CDC regarding preventing the spread of COVID-19, *starting Wednesday, March 18, our location is not open to the public.* Our dedicated staff will rotate office coverage to maintain the operations of Sheboygan County Food Bank and work remotely. In addition, small groups of volunteers will assist with operations.

Food Pantries are Open with Modified Distribution Methods

At this time, **all food pantries are staying open** and transitioning to handing out prepackaged emergency food boxes, but may have modified hours. Please [check our website](#) daily for the latest updates and FAQs related to emergency food.
